1. New Charter

Reasoned to YE/FL becoming a Standing Committee of the WFEO, it was necessary to update the previous charter. The new charter is attached to these minutes as "Attachment No.1"

2. "Young Engineers / Future Leaders convention" in Kuwait spring 2013

YE/FL plans to hold an International Young Engineers Convention in February 2013. It aims to have 1000 international Young Engineer participants for a three day program. The three daily topics are:

Youth, Engineering and Technology, International Relations

It is important that all national delegates forward all information regarding YE/FL activities to their countries and support and promote these activities.

A Website will be launched soon and partners are yet to find.

3. Cooperation with UNESCO

We have contacted UNESCO to be a part of the WFEO YE/FL youth convention to be held in Kuwait from 10th to 12th February 2013.

The chair Eng. Zainab Lari had attended the 7th UNESCO Youth Forum from 17th to 20th October 2011 in Paris. We are also looking forward to attend the upcoming UNESCO Youth forums.

5. Young Engineers Australia Initiatives

- Engineers Australia named 2011 the Year of Humanitarian Engineering, and put focus on engineering for developing communities and groups in need. There were events nationally.
- Engineers Australia, Engineers Without Borders and RedR (Registered Engineers for Disaster Relief) collaborated on a major National Conference in November, called Imagineering 2011 on the theme of humanitarian engineering.
- Young Engineers Australia held a major conference in partnership with the Centre for Engineering Leadership and Management in May 2012.
- Australia is putting forward a bid to host the 2019 World Engineering Convention in Melbourne.
- Chapters of YEA have continued to be active in social, educational and professional development events. Young engineers (defined in Australia as students and those under 35) remain a significant portion for Engineers Australia's membership.

7. Thesis database

Especially developing countries have less access to scientific resources on which their researches can relate to. In order to support researches globally YE/FL supports an idea first expressed 2009 in Kuwait by a young engineer. YE/FL will share links and descriptions to thesis and research databases. Here the input from all national delegates and corresponding members is the essential key for the success of this initiative.



8. International Ring Ceremony

The ring ceremony or also called “The Ritual of the Calling of an Engineer” is an ceremony founded in Canada and adopted in the US. Like the Hippocratic Oath engineers swear to practice engineering ethically and honestly. This will not only be good public relations for YE/FL, but also the global society will benefit from this first step of ethnical engineering.

The next steps are to find cooperation partners, prepare a ring design and an oath.
The South African delegate will take over this project, as it already prepared the “Credo of the African Engineer”

I am an engineer and in my profession I take deep pride.

To it I owe solemn obligations.

Since the origins of humanity on the continent of Africa,
human progress has been spurred by the engineering genius.

Engineers have made nature’s vast resources of material

10. World Engineering Summit in Singapore (WES 2013)

Important issues, which the preparation of the conference has to face:

- YE usually need funds to join conferences, especially from disadvantaged communities
- Founding for 50 attendees might be needed.
- Normal registration fee for 8 days is 1000 USD until now.

Action:

Find founding for the events and attendees (hotel 20% off, no registration fee)

For the preparation of WES 2013 and all following conferences a YE/FL subgroup should prepare a YE program template. Also experience from last conference must be conserved. For this case the last conferences organizer must join the new organization team. In this case the Slovenian delegate.

As a tip:

Online registering should generate a letter for asking companies for funds (company name blank).
